and South Poles. They will participate in a detailed exploration of the environmental factors that shape and influence this

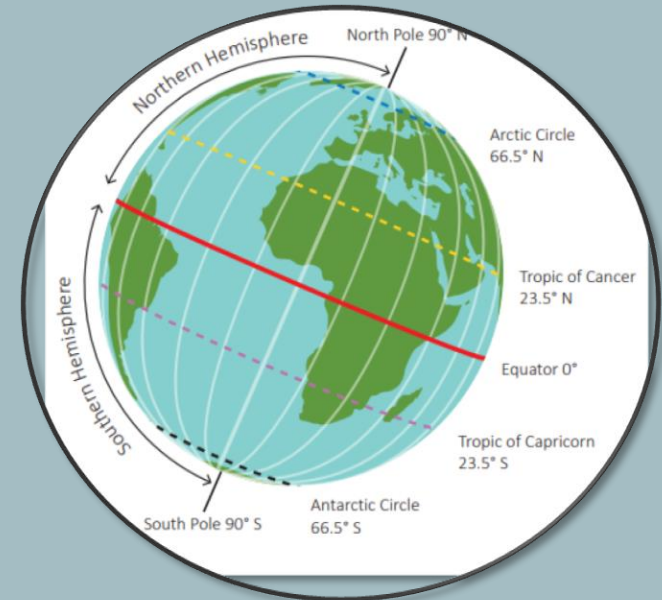
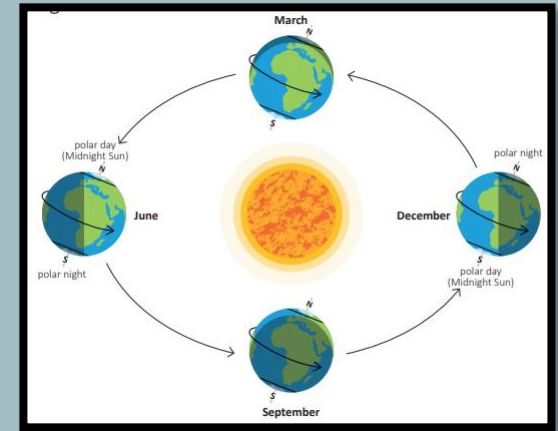
Landscape.

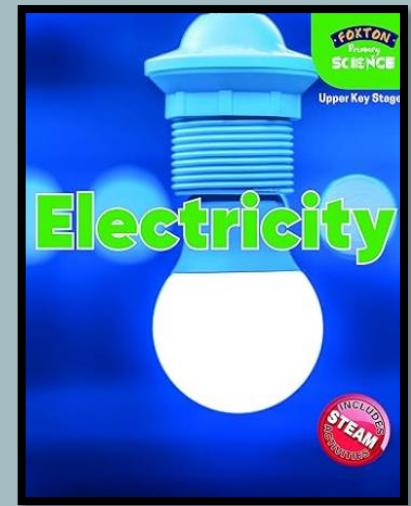
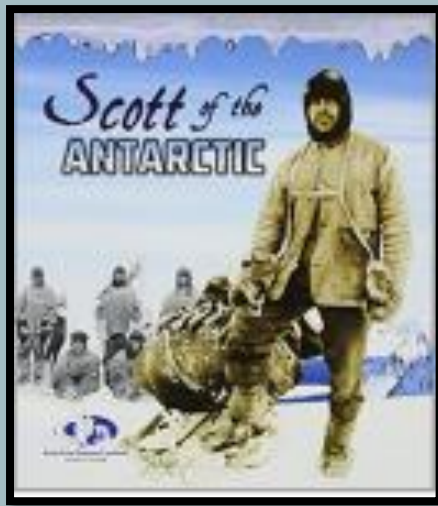

Throughout time, there have been many explorations of the polar regions. Use the internet and other source materials to find out about polar explorers and their discoveries. Create a timeline to show significant polar explorations that took place between 1770 and 1920.

Use online and other historical resources to find out what happened to the RMS Titanic. Write an account to explain what happened, including how polar features were instrumental in its downfall.
